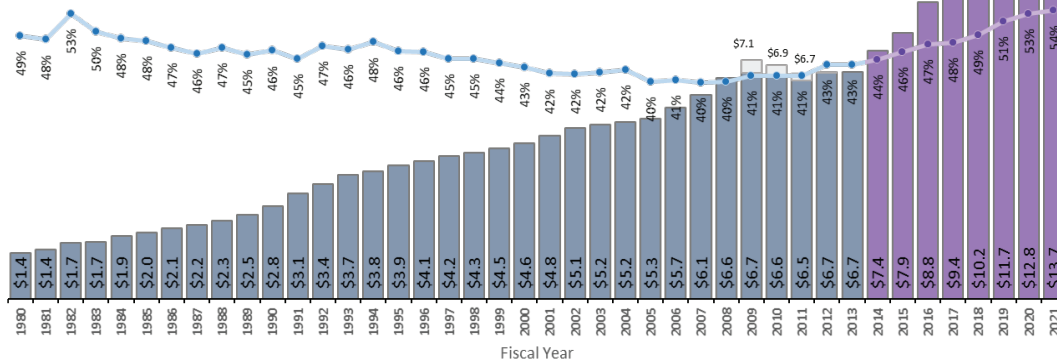

Doubled Public School Funding
