<u>Address the Opioid Crisis</u>: As nurses, we see the effects of the opioid crisis every day in our hospitals and our communities. Will you support legislation to further prevent, and provide treatment for, opioid addiction in our communities?

<u>Nursing Education Funding</u>: Nursing schools are consistently turning away qualified applicants due to a lack of slots and the difficulties in recruiting nursing faculty. Will you support funding to improve recruitment and retention of nursing faculty?
